- Hunger/gluttony, thirst/drunkenness, sleep/laziness, Sex/Sexual immorality
- Lust of the flesh
 - o Appeal to our fallen nature hunger, thirst, sex
- Lust of the eyes
 - Pleasures that satisfy sight and mind
- Pride of Life
 - o Superior attitude, impressing others, boasting
